Why is the Bible a special book for Christians?

New Knowledge:

- The Bible is the Christian holy book, which uses stories called parables to teach Christians to be good people – making it very important to the Christian community.
- Christians believe that the bible is the word of God.
- It is divided into the Old and New Testaments – each have books written by different people.
- The Old Testament is made up of 39 books and the New Testament is made up of 27 books.
- The story of David and Goliath teaches Christians to show courage. David showed courage, because although he was small he offered to fight and defeated a stronger man to save the rest of his people from slavery.
- The story of The Stilling of The Storm helps Christians because it teaches them that Jesus takes care of us.
- Christians pray to feel closer to God, ask for guidance and to show they are grateful.
- The Lord's Prayer, taught by Jesus to his friends, is the most popular Christian prayer.
